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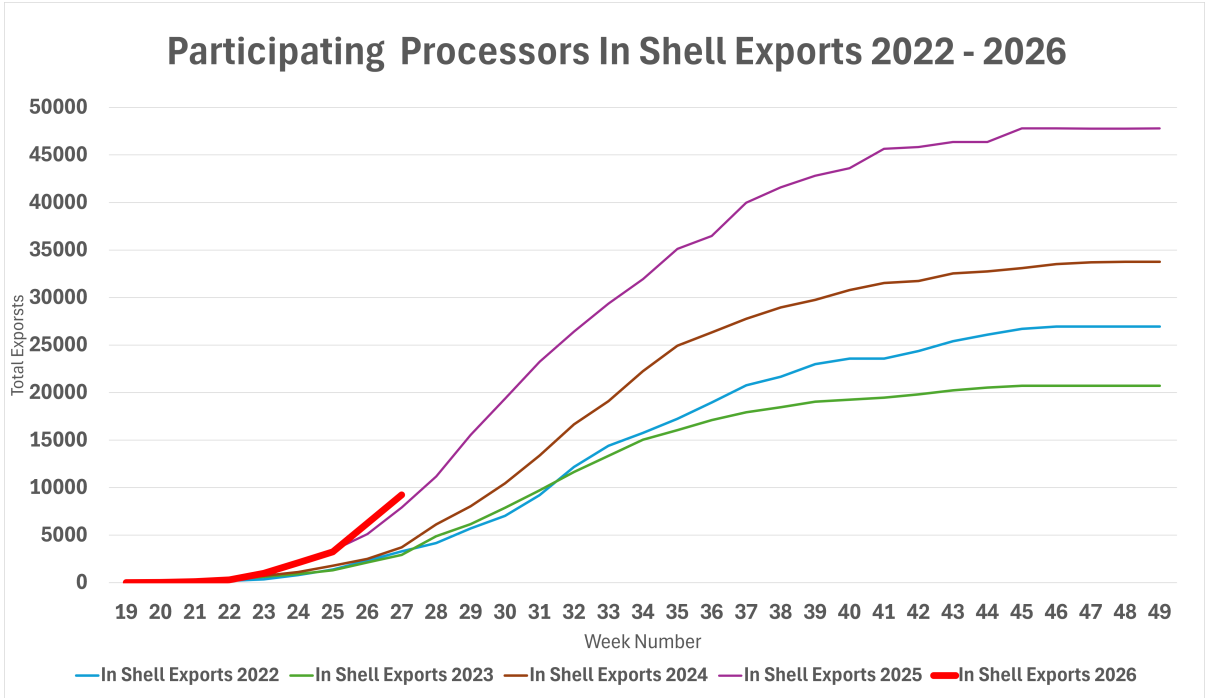
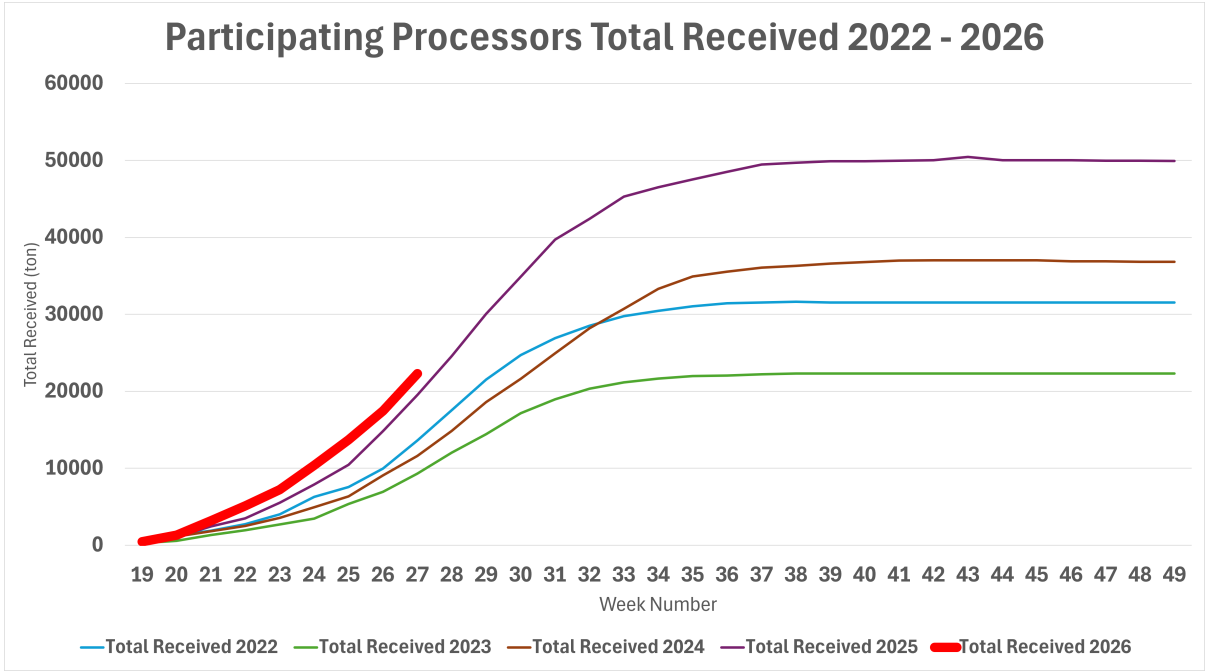

2026 Harvest Tracker: How Does This Season Compare?



As the South African pecan harvest continues to gain momentum, one of the most interesting ways to assess the season is to compare harvest progress with previous years. By looking at the percentage of the final crop that had been received by the same week in earlier seasons, we can place the current harvest into valuable historical context.

By the end of Week 27, South African handlers had received 22,277 tonnes of pecans. Historically, this point in the season has represented:

- 43.1% of the final crop in 2022
- 41.6% in 2023
- 31.6% in 2024
- 39.1% in 2025

Across these four seasons, an average of 38.9% of the final crop had been delivered by Week 27.

If the 2026 harvest follows an average historical pattern, the current delivery pace would indicate a final crop of approximately 57,300 tonnes. This historical comparison does not replace SAPPA's existing crop estimation process. Instead, it adds another objective, data-driven tool that is used alongside the current methodology to improve the accuracy of the official crop estimate as the harvest progresses. As always, weather conditions, seasonal differences, processing capacity and the timing of harvests can influence how closely the current season follows historical trends.

The export figures are equally encouraging. By Week 27, South Africa had already exported 9,224 tonnes of in-shell pecans. Relative to the crop received so far, this means that approximately 41.4% of all deliveries have already been exported. This compares favourably with previous seasons:

Season In-shell exports as % of crop received (Week 27)

- 2022: 24.1%
- 2023: 31.5%
- 2024: 31.9%
- 2025: 40.6%
- 2026: 41.4%

This suggests that exporters continue to move product through the supply chain at an impressive pace, despite the larger volumes being harvested.

Although it remains early in the harvest, both deliveries and exports indicate another strong year for the South African pecan industry. As more data become available

over the coming weeks, these comparisons will provide an increasingly accurate picture of where the 2026 crop is likely to finish.

SAPPA Kultivargids Nou Beskikbaar



SAPPA stel met trots die **Pekanneut Kultivargids** bekend.

Hierdie omvattende gids bevat hoë-resolusie foto's van pekanneute, kern en deursnitbeelde, tesame met afmetings en beskrywings van die verskillende kultivars.

Die publikasie is spesifiek saamgestel om produsente te ondersteun met die identifikasie van pekanneutkultivars in die veld en tydens oes.

Deur die kombinasie van visuele verwysings en beskrywende inligting word produsente beter toegerus om moontlike kultivars te identifiseer en van mekaar te onderskei.

Ons versoek vriendelik dat die gids slegs vir plaaslike gebruik aangewend word en dat geen elektroniese weergawes met kliënte of ander eksterne partye gedeel word nie.

Daar bestaan 'n risiko dat internasionale kopers neut teen die foto's in die gids kan vergelyk en moontlik vragte afkeur indien die produk nie presies soos die verwysingsfoto's voorkom nie.

Die gids is uitsluitlik bedoel as 'n hulpmiddel vir kultivaridentifikasie en nie as 'n kommersiële kwaliteitsverwysing nie.

Diefstal van Neute: Nuwe Produsente Inligtings- en Verklaringsvorm

SAPPA werk deurlopend saam met produsente, verwerkers en ander rolspelers om die Suid-Afrikaanse pekanneutbedryf te beskerm en die handel van gesteelde pekanneute te ontmoedig.

As deel van hierdie poging is 'n Produsente Inligtings- en Verklaringsvorm ontwikkel. Verwerkers sal produsente voortaan versoek om hierdie inligting te verskaf wanneer pekanneute gelewer word.

Die doel van die vorm is om die herkoms van produkte beter te kan verifieer en dit moeiliker te maak vir gesteelde pekanneute om die formele bemarkingskanaal te betree. SAPPA versoek alle produsente om hul samewerking te gee wanneer hierdie inligting aangevra word.

Hierdie inisiatief vorm deel van ons gesamentlike poging om die integriteit en volhoubaarheid van die Suid-Afrikaanse pekanneutbedryf te beskerm.

Markimplikasies van groeireguleerders: Wat pekanneutprodusente moet weet

Plantgroeireguleerders, soos paclobutrazol (PBZ), word wêreldwyd in verskeie gewasse gebruik en daar word aangevoer dat dit onder bepaalde omstandighede voordele soos groeibeheer en verbeterde boomprestasie kan bied. Die gebruik daarvan bly egter 'n onderwerp wat deeglik oorweeg moet word, veral in uitvoergeoriënteerde bedrywe waar regulatoriese vereistes en marktoegang dikwels swaarder weeg as die potensiele agnomiese voordele.

Die internasionale mark stel toenemend streng vereistes. Die VSA handhaaf 'n nul-residu beleid vir PBZ op pekanneute, terwyl die EU en China slegs uiters lae residuvlakke toelaat. Benewens regulatoriese vereistes kan kopersentiment ook 'n groot invloed hê op marktoegang, selfs wanneer produkte aan wetlike vereistes voldoen.

Hierdie artikel verduidelik die werking van groeireguleerders, die rol van PBZ in pekanproduksie, SAPPA se navorsingsbevindinge, asook die belangrike uitvoer- en markimplikasies wat produsente in ag moet neem. Dit bied waardevolle konteks vir produsente wat ingeligte besluite oor die gebruik van groeireguleerders wil neem, met spesifieke verwysing na die risiko's wat internasionale markte en uitvoervereistes inhou.

SAPPA ondersteun opkomende pekanprodusent



SAPPA is trots om die ontwikkeling van opkomende pekanprodusente te ondersteun. Een so 'n voorbeeld is Crisp, wat in Desember 2023 perseel 6H13 in die Vaalharts-gebied naby Hartswater deur die Land Bank se Blended Finance-program bekom het.

Sedertdien werk SAPPA nou saam met Crisp om die nodige tegniese ondersteuning en kennis te bied om 'n suksesvolle pekanboerdery te vestig. In 2024 het SAPPA gehelp om 120 pekanbome te voorsien om oop spasies in die bestaande boord aan te vul. Crisp se plaas beslaan 24,5 ha pekans, waarvan die bome nou byna volle produksie bereik.

Gedurende die 2026-seisoen ondersteun SAPPA Crisp verder met die vestiging van 'n nuwe besproeiingstelsel. Die materiaal is reeds aangekoop en die pomphuis is voltooi. Sodra die huidige oesseisoen afgehandel is, sal Crisp met die installasie begin sodat die stelsel gereed is voordat die bome weer begin bot.



SAPPA sien daarna uit om Crisp ook in die toekoms met tegniese ondersteuning en, waar moontlik, verdere ontwikkelingshulp by te staan. Hierdie projek is 'n mooi voorbeeld van hoe samewerking en doelgerigte ondersteuning kan bydra tot die volhoubare ontwikkeling van die Suid-Afrikaanse pekanbedryf.
